## Thursday, September 22: **Cyber Safety**

*Attorney General's Office*

This presentation covers potential internet threats, how to prevent internet crimes against children and solutions to issues such as cyberbullying, and online predators. The Office of The Attorney General encourages New Mexicans to overcome the growing epidemic of internet crimes by becoming aware and proactive to the power and peril of the internet.

## Thursday, November 3: **Recognizing the Signs of Drug Use**

This session will help you, as a parent, recognize and identify behaviors or signs that indicate your child or child's friends may be experimenting with drugs, what methods or interventions parents can use to help prevent drug use, and overall awareness of drug use among kids.
